

Citing sources demonstrates the **quality of your approach** and work ethic. The references associated with each of the pieces of information you include in your assignment **inspire confidence in your reader**. By correctly citing your sources, you show that the quality of your work lies in a **variety of sources** and you avoid plagiarism.

Verify these elements to ensure the quality of your assignment and avoid plagiarism.	Verified :
1- I have found facts or ideas on the Internet or in a document and I have expressed them in my own words : - After including the information, I have mentioned the name of the author, the year of publication, and the page or paragraph number, as indicated in the referencing tool. - In the Works Cited list¹ at the end of the assignment, I have included the complete reference as indicated in the referencing tool.	☐
2 I have copied a portion of text from the Internet or from a document : - I have put the copied excerpt between quotation marks. ("...") - After the quotation marks, I have mentioned the name of the author, the year of publication, and the page or paragraph number, as indicated in the referencing tool. - In the Works Cited list¹ at the end of the assignment, I have included the complete reference as indicated in the referencing tool.	☐
3 I have included an image, table or other visual element found on the Internet or in a document : - Under the visual element, I have mentioned the name of the author, the year of publication, and the page or paragraph number, as indicated in the referencing tool. - In the Works Cited list¹ at the end of the assignment, I have included the complete reference as indicated in the referencing tool.	☐
4 All of the entries in my Works Cited list <u>also</u> appear in the text in the (author, date) format and all of the parenthetical references in the text <u>also</u> appear in the Works Cited list.	☐
